

March 18, 2010 SAC Meeting Notes

Meeting Start: 15:30 SAC President, presided over meeting. Minutes from 11 February approved.

STUDENT GOVERNMENT ML reported that planning prom is going well. The HD Castle is reserved and decorations are ordered. Principal mentioned a conflict with a sporting event on the day of prom, but that is being worked on. Morgan also reported that there is more HHS student interest in Student2Student survey for matching in-coming students with present students. SLO suggested gathering testimonials and creating a power point presentation so that this program can be entered in an upcoming competition in Washington DC by the 1 April deadline. ET agreed that this is possible.

CK walked members through the HHS' Continuous School Improvement plan, how it has been modified since its creation in 2005-06, and where we are heading before our evaluation next school year. Parents and students be involved in our SIP and the upcoming NCA visit. Comments through PTISO's comment box might be valuable "evidence" for our SIP Evaluation.

SAC – asked what they can do for HHS and explained that we reach out to our community as we go through the SIP process, encouraging parents to participate in faculty meetings and on committees during the evaluation.

PTISO – reported that fundraising is going great. They expressed a desire to have a new teacher representative now that Ms. Yoesting is gone. HCSC is offering a grant opportunity for students, and PTISO has money (without HCSC) on hand for school needs. *Footloose* was awesome! Ticket sales brought in \$5600 and concession \$600. Members continue to raise funds by selling sausages at lunch.

BOOSTER CLUB will be sharing a table at registration to recruit members for next year. The 25th of March, they will sell homemade meatball subs during lunch.

Principal explained how Terra Nova testing is used by DoDEA, and that it would take place the following week.

Students have been very good. Changes to policies about iPods have been positive, and Principal was contacted by two schools requesting information regarding the effects of those changes.

AP Exams begin the first week of May.

Senior Award Ceremony will be held in the gym this year so all students and parents can participate.

A student has been accepted into a highly regarded and competitive summer science program at MIT.

USAG Representative reported that COL White will leave soon and be away for a while. COL Butcher will handle anything during his absence. Kids are generally doing well however, MP patrols will be stepped up, especially around the Bowling Alley and in parks.
